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# Spell out the best land supply options for Hong Kong

*The Institute is happy with the co-operation with fellow professional bodies to draft a response to the consultation on Government's Land Supply options, but the options need improvement to make them clearer to the public.*

As befits an organisation replete with professional experts in the subject of land supply, HKIS members enthusiastically voiced a raft of suggestions that enriched the territory-wide public consultation on Government's 18 different land supply options, which ended on 26 September. The Institute spared no effort in airing its views throughout the consultation process. As well as gathering feedback from members via an opinion survey and discussion forums, it also took the discussion further by partnering with three other professional institutes, the Hong Kong Institute of Architects, the Hong Kong Institute of Landscape Architects and the Hong Kong Institute of Planners for a joint press conference to declare their collective views and concerns.

Looking back at the five-month consultation exercise, the HKIS's own Land Supply Task Force, formed under the Institute's Land Policy Panel early this year, was deeply involved with all preparatory work. Convened by Senior Vice-President Sr Dr Tony Leung, the task force was appointed by President Sr Dick Kwok, who regards the land supply situation as a long-term future commitment, with the HKIS heavily involved in finding the way forward.

“We are treating this one with a high level of respect,” Sr Dr Tony Leung said, “by appointing members like me, Sr K K Chiu (Chairman of General Practice Division) and Honorary Treasurer Sr Alexander Lam. On top of this we recruited about 30 volunteers to provide help and support. As the subject touches issues like valuation, development, plot ratio and land lease, most of these volunteers hailed from General Practice Division and Planning and Development Division with hands-on knowledge. We periodically meet with them to ensure their contribution continues smoothly. So far, diverse views from various channels have been collected. Meanwhile, some creative ideas have emerged

internally such as the suggested reclamation of Plover Cove for housing development. This controversial idea came from one of our members so we specially invited him to elaborate more during our members' forum. The HKIS is an open organisation with the forum serving as a platform to let various voices to be heard.”

On 18 September, the HKIS put forward seven key suggestions covering general views, perspectives on 18 land supply ideas and further suggestions. Meanwhile, Sr Dr Leung rated it a balanced approach because views were also sought from different channels such as members' forums and a joint forum with four professional institutes. Moreover, the HKIS's active participation in numerous events organised by Sr Tony Tse, Legislative Councillor representing the Architectural, Surveying, Planning and Landscape functional constituency, and new contacts generated from Government's Task Force on Land Supply (TFLS) gave the Institute additional professional bodies and organisations to exchange with.

“When we compared our key suggestions with TFLS's preliminary observations, we found some consensus,” Sr Dr Leung said. “For instance, we agreed on a common phenomenon – the biggest being the acute shortage of land supply. Then it's HK2030+, that the city needs 1,200 hectare of land in future. We also supported the development of the East Lantau Metropolis by forming artificial islands. But that's still not sufficient so we took it further by proposing Government to reserve additional land as a 'land bank', development of brownfield sites in public-private partnership, and near-shore reclamation outside Victoria Harbour.

“We particularly urged relaxation of plot ratios in strategic areas in urban districts and the New Territories. For example, it is hoped an increase of gross floor area in districts like Kowloon City,

Ma Tau Wai, Ma Tau Kok and Sham Shui Po, from the current 7.5 to 8 for domestic Class A sites, subject to infrastructure requirement and sufficiency. Likewise, in the New Territories as the ratio stands at 0.2 to maximum 0.75 at the moment, we would like it to be relaxed to 2.1-3.6 for a larger scale of supply.”

HKIS President Sr Dick Kwok points out that, for years now Hong Kong families have been baffled by the housing and land supply situation, particularly now that prices are escalating, supply and demand is unbalanced and there are signs that the situation is getting worse. “Many citizens, especially those don’t have their own homes, feel pressured,” he says. “Even young professionals are directly affected, with some HKIS corporate members frustrated since their salary can’t catch up with the required down payment. But no one single option can resolve all problems once and for all so what we proposed is beyond the 18 options. I believe that government policy and administration should match in order to maximise the function. Otherwise, obstacles like discrepancies will occur when executing those options. For instance, the TFLS could eventually evolve into a dedicated bureau similar to New Territories Development Department established in 1970s, and report to the Chief Executive.

“There is still room for improvement for this public consultation. To us, these 18 options proposed looked like a dim sum order form made up of small, medium to large dishes that cover various areas of cuisine. In other words, they cover policy, project and even a combination of both. That’s easy to get confused by, so it should be presented in categories. For instance, reclamation is a policy and reclamation projects are not all the same. Project and policy discussion are different in depth and direction. Overall, we support the policy of reclamation outside Victoria Harbour

as long as various concerns like environmental impact are addressed. If all 18 options can be narrowed down to two or three, the public might understand it better.”

Recounting the HKIS’s level of participation throughout this public engagement exercise, Sr Kwok is more than happy with its achievements. Among these was the invitation by TFLS chairman Mr Stanley Wong to brief members in a members’ forum followed by a Q&A session and a joint press conference by four institutes. Sr Kwok is proud of the devotion, saying, “All four institutes have their own land supply task force and you can imagine the process reaching consensus prior to the press conference at our stand. It really took time to agree to final key points with the other institutes and put our shared views under the spotlight.”

The task force’s job doesn’t end there. The team will closely monitor how the TFLS performs and look at upcoming government policy to tackle the subject. “We’d also continue to push our ‘land bank’ concept and the setting-up of a centralised government department within and outside Institute,” says Sr Kwok, “hopefully more people and Government accept this and implement it. We expressed our gratitude for this exercise and we are happy to see this as a very good opportunity to let people openly discuss and research solutions. There is no doubt about Government’s sincere intention, as a lot of time is invested to organise different formats of consultations like town hall meetings to access people from different walks of life. It is such a big leap for Government to solicit solutions from the community and we hope it will end up with compromises on solutions for Hong Kong or things will stagnate and we can’t move forward. This is something we don’t want to see.”

# 為香港尋求最佳 土地供應選項

香港測量師學會樂意與多個專業團體合作，回應政府就土地供應展開的諮詢，但有關選項仍待加強改進，才能使公眾更清楚明白。

香港測量師學會精英雲集，會員當中不乏熟識土地供應問題的專家，他們出謀獻策，在土地供應專責小組公眾參與活動完結前（9月26日），就政府提出的18個土地供應選項表達意見。期間學會不遺餘力地向公眾講解想法。除了以問卷和論壇形式收集會員意見之外，學會更與其他三個專業學會合作，包括香港建築師學會、香港園境師學會和香港規劃師學會，召開聯合記者會，表達我們的意見和關注的地方。

回顧為期五個月的公眾諮詢期，學會今年初在土地政策小組旗下成立的土地供應專責小組，積極進行籌備工作。香港測量師學會會長郭岳忠測量師委任高級副會長梁家棟博士測量師擔任小組召集人，他認為土地供應是一項長期而又影響深遠的工作，香港測量師學會將盡力找出可行方案。

梁家棟博士測量師說：「我們視這次土地供應公眾諮詢為重中之重，學會委任本人、產業測量組主席趙錦權測量師和義務司庫林增榮測量師擔任小組成員，另外還招募了30位義工幫忙。由於土地供應涉及估價、發展、地積比率和土地租賃等範疇，大部份義工都來自產業測量組和規劃及發展組，而且具備相關知識。我們定期開會，確保他們的工作順利進行。我們已從不同渠道收集了各方意見，當中有很多新穎的提議，例如填平船灣淡水湖作樓宇發展之用。有關建議引起爭議，我們邀請了提出建議的該名會員出席論壇，講述建議內容。香港測量師學會是一個開放的機構，召開論壇旨在提供平台讓大家聆聽各方意見。」

學會在9月18日公布七大建議，就18個土地供應選項作出回應。梁家棟博士測量師認為建議平衡各方意見，有關內容涵蓋了不同人士的想法，並透過會員論壇和與四大專業學會召開的聯合論壇收集而得。另外，學會積極參與由立法會建築、測量、都市規劃及園境界功能界別議員謝偉銓測量師召開的各項活動，同時透過政府的土地供應專責小組與更多專業團體和機構交流意見。

梁家棟博士測量師說：「若拿我們的建議和土地供應小組最初的觀察作對比，我們發現兩者有相同之處。例如雙方都同意香港目前面對的最大問題是土地供應嚴重不足，根據《香港2030+》，香港未來發展需要1,200公頃土地。另外，我們支持興建人工島，發展東大嶼都會。但這些仍不足夠解決問題，所以我們建議政府預留土地作儲備、探索以公私營合作機制發展棕地，以及在維港以外近岸海域填海。」

「我們特別提到放寬市區和新界部分重點發展區的地積比率，希望可藉此增加九龍城、馬頭圍、馬頭角和深水埗這些地區的總樓面面積，在符

合建築物要求和空間足夠的情況下，將甲類地盤的地積比率由目前的7.5倍增加至8倍。同樣地，新界地區目前的地積比率為0.2倍至0.75倍，我們建議放寬至2.1倍至3.6倍，從而增加土地供應。」

香港測量師學會會長郭岳忠測量師指出，本港家庭一直受制於樓宇和土地供應的問題，由是近年樓價屢創新高，供需失衡，情況更有每況愈下的跡象。他說：「很多市民都感到壓力，首當其衝更是那些沒有自置物業的市民。即使是年輕的專業人士同樣受到影響，不少本會會員對於自己的薪金水平無法支付首期而不滿。單憑一個選項是無法解決全部問題，所以我們在18個選項以外再提出更多想法。我認為政府政策要與行政互相配合才能達到目的，否則這些選項執行起來會引起分歧。例如土地供應專責小組最終應轉型為一個正規的政府部門，並直接向行政長官匯報工作，類似在1970年代成立的新界拓展署。」

「今次公眾諮詢仍有改善的空間。對我們來說，這18個選項就像酒樓的點心紙一樣，有小點、中點和大點任君挑選。換言之，這些選項包括政策、項目以及兩者兼備。市民不明就裡，所以應該分類表達。例如填海是一個政策，與填海項目不同。討論項目和討論政策，兩者的深度和方向亦不一樣。簡單地說，只要顧及對環境的影響，我們支持在維港以外的填海政策。如果18個選項可以分為兩至三個類別，公眾會更易掌握。」

總結香港測量師學會在今次公眾諮詢的參與程度，郭岳忠測量師對成果感到很滿意，當中包括邀請土地供應專責小組主席黃遠輝先生出席會員論壇講述政府的想法並回應會員的提問，以及與四大專業學會召開聯合記者會。郭岳忠測量師說：「四大專業學會各自成立土地供應專責小組，在召開記者會之前，先要取得共識，過程殊不簡單，需要很多時間與各學會落實重點，最後才能向公眾講解我們的意見。」

本會的土地供應小組未有放慢腳步，未來會緊密地監察政府土地供應小組的工作，以及跟進政府在有關方面的政策。郭岳忠測量師說：「我們會繼續在學會內外推動『土地儲備』和成立統一的政府部門這兩個概念，希望市民和政府會接納，繼而執行。我們樂意參與其中，這是一個大好機會讓公眾討論和找出解決方法。政府解決問題的決心是有目共睹的，包括舉辦公眾論壇等不同活動，收集市民的意見。政府聆聽民意，從中找出解決方法，無疑是一大進步，我們希望各方求同存異，否則問題只會依舊存在，阻礙香港發展，這不是我們想見到的局面。」

With a spate of networking events, annual conferences and overseas missions lined up this month, HKIS enters its usual peak season. We offered our comments to the Chief Executive's 2018 Policy Address, which set the direction on land and housing supply with the policies it proposed. Meanwhile, we successfully wrapped up the signature "Create Your District" Competition on 27 October with an Awards Presentation Ceremony in Wan Chai. My sincere thanks to sponsors, partners and members.

### **HKIS Annual Conference 2018**

Our annual conference drew over 300 industry leaders, academics and Government officials to solicit views on Hong Kong's housing challenge. I would like to extend my sincere gratitude to all who participated in this flagship event.

### **Setting footprints in China**

From 27 to 30 September I made an official visit to Beijing, accompanied by the Mainland Committee Chairman and two Young Surveyors Group members, joining the National Day Delegation from the Architectural, Surveying, Planning and Landscape Sector. Prior to this trip, HKIS also set its footprint on the Greater Bay Area on 21-23 October with four professional institutes. Co-organised with LegCo member Sr Tony Tse, the field study trip to Huizhou covered three perspectives - city development and ecological conservation, environmental innovation and drinking water management.

### **Adios to "Create Your District" Campaign**

We adopted a multi-pronged approach to drumming up interest in our "Create Your District" campaign. Apart from a competition, a mobile broadcast truck loaded with information about the HKIS was deployed to many schools and local communities. In addition, exhibits like eight winning 3D models and six multimedia films selected from the "Create Your District" Competition were featured at the 12-day exhibition on Lee Tung Avenue, drawing more than

2,000 visitors on opening day. On 27 October I announced all winners at the Awards Presentation Ceremony. The event would not have been so successful without support from industry stakeholders. For instance, the Urban Renewal Authority unprecedentedly became our Strategic Partner for this event. It assigned an official to be a juror at the Jury Assessment Presentation, and sponsored the "Urban Renewal Authority Community and Sustainable Development Award" to encourage students to better understand the community and to unleash their creativity. About 200 students from 31 secondary schools took part in the competition.

### **MOU signing with Singapore Institute of Planners**

For years we have enjoyed networking and communications with the Singapore Institute of Planners. Together with Planning and Development Division Chairman Sr Edmond Yew I flew to Singapore on 18 October to sign a Memorandum of Understanding that for sure will take both Institutes to the next level. It's hoped that the partnership will foster future cooperation and exchanges.

### **BSD Annual Conference 2018**

The HKIS Building Surveying Division Annual Conference 2018 addressed the theme "Beyond the Build: Buildability, Sustainability and Maintainability". With over 250 participants, it invited Ir LIU Chun-san, JP, Under Secretary for Development of the HKSAR, as Guest of Honour to deliver the opening remarks, while professionals from the Government, the surveying and property sectors and academia discussed how current policies and practices contribute to the future of building development in Hong Kong.

### **"Building Safety Pioneer Programme" Joint Talk 2018**

On 20 October I represented the HKIS at this event, organised by the Buildings Department and co-organised by the Education Bureau and HK Education City Ltd. The programme drew secondary students to nurture their interest in the building industry for career development. During this inaugural ceremony I gave a 15-minute presentation introducing what the HKIS does.

### **Building external bonds**

We are kept busy joining varied activities with Government departments and industry. On 19 September, our lunch meeting with the Secretary for Transport and Housing Bureau exchanged views on housing policy. It took place shortly after the super typhoon seriously battered the



territory, so our Office Bearers, Division Chairmen and Policy Panel Chairmen could also share ideas on post-typhoon transportation management. Then, a drinks gathering with the Director and senior staff of the Lands Department was held on 8 October and a network gathering with the Planning Department the next day. Our lunch with Urban Renewal Authority's Sr Victor So and Ir Wai Chi Sing on 12 October was treated as a vital networking occasion for HKIS Policy Panels and Office Bearers. On the same day (12 October), both Land Surveying Division and Planning and Development Division held their annual dinner events, echoing with one of our main objectives this year - connecting our members with other professional bodies, Government departments and non-Government organisations.

### Chief Executive's 2018 Policy Address

HKIS appreciated Government's concern regarding land development and housing supply in the latest Policy Address. We lend our support to the overall direction, such as Lantau Tomorrow Vision, public and private housing ratio and revitalisation of industrial buildings. ### 香港測量師學會 2018 年周年研討會

### 前往內地考察

我和內地事務委員會主席以及兩位青年組會員在 9 月 27 日至 30 日前往北京，完成一連三日的國慶訪京團交流活動，訪京團包括來自建築、測量、規劃和園境界的專業人士。本會在訪京前與四大專業學會在 10 月 21 至 23 日訪問了大灣區。惠州實地考察團由四會與立法會議員謝偉銓測量師合辦，內容包括研究城市發展和生態保育、環境創新和食水管理。

### 地區發展創作比賽圓滿落幕

我們採用多管齊下的宣傳方式，向公眾推廣「細看社區歷史 構

建『你』想灣仔」地區發展創作比賽。在比賽以外，我們安排流動車穿梭各區中學和鬧市，展出更多關於本會的資訊。另外，我們在利東街舉行了為期 12 日的展覽，展出比賽得獎作品，包括八個三維模型和六段多媒體影片，吸引了超過 2,000 名市民到場觀看。我們在 10 月 27 日舉辦頒獎典禮，公布得獎作品。今次活動得以圓滿落幕，實有賴各界支持，其中包括首次擔任活動策略夥伴的市區重建局。在決賽入圍者面試的階段，市區重建局更派出一名官員擔任評審。當局又贊助「市區重建局社區及可持續發展大獎」，鼓勵學生多認識社區和發揮創意。約 200 名來自 31 間中學的學生參加今次比賽。

### 與新加坡規劃師學會簽署合作備忘錄

我們過往一直與新加坡規劃師學會保持緊密聯繫。10 月 18 日，我和規劃及發展組主席姚逸明測量師前往新加坡，雙方簽署合作備忘錄，期望日後有更多合作和交流的機會。

### 建築測量組 2018 年周年研討會

建築測量組 2018 年周年研討會的主題是「高瞻遠矚：構建明日」，吸引超過 250 人出席。大會邀請了發展局副局長廖振新工程師太平紳士擔任主禮嘉賓，並致開幕詞。出席研討會的精英來自政府、測量界、建築界和學界，都藉此互相交流，討論現行政策和措施如何改善香港建築環境及發展。

## Create Your District Competition

### EFFECTS OF THE INCENTIVE SCHEME ON CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTING BEHAVIOUR

**Undergraduate: Top Award (QS)**  
**Awardee: LEE Ka Wai, Kelly**  
**(City University of Hong Kong)**

Effective cooperation among professionals from diverse disciplines is a necessary condition for project success. However, the goals and motivations of each contracting party may not always align. Therefore, the HKSAR Government has piloted contractual partnering procurement by relying on incentives.

Incentive schemes aim to align each contracting party's objectives by motivating them to adopt the client's project objectives. Past studies claimed that the provision of incentives can create a more cooperative relationship between contracting parties, but offered little empirical evidence of this (Suprpto et al., 2015; Meng & Gallagher, 2012).

This study aims to fill this research gap by investigating the relationship between incentivisation and cooperation in construction contracting. The author developed a conceptual framework from the literature on the concepts

of interdependency and cooperation to explain their interrelationships. **The main hypothesis is that cooperative behaviour can result from the use of incentive schemes that engender an interdependency effect.**

A questionnaire was conducted for data collection purposes. One hundred valid responses were received from construction professionals based mainly in Hong Kong, China, and Singapore. Structural Equation Modelling (PLS-SEM) was adopted for structural model testing.

- **Results:** the model results generally supported the hypotheses. Incentive schemes can engender interdependency between contracting parties from economic and psychological perspectives, which eventually lead to greater cooperation between them.
- **Interdependency from a Psychological Perspective:** under incentive schemes, contracting parties jointly develop and pursue mutual objectives. A high level of mutual involvement can establish and build trust (Saxton, 1997). A greater level of trust reduces each party's perception of the risk that comes from relying on each other and feeling vulnerable.
- **Interdependency from an Economic Perspective:** to achieve the objectives set in incentive schemes, each party may need to make a specific investment in terms of plant and human assets to monitor performance and maintain its relationships. From an economic perspective, each contracting party is encouraged to extend the length of its relationship due to the amount of sunk investment made.
- **Interdependency Leading to Cooperative Behaviour:** when each party is highly interdependent, it tends to value the other's



resources and abilities (Tjosvold et al., 2001). More future economic exchanges are then anticipated. Each party is willing to cooperate to fulfill the agreed-upon common goals (Lush and Brown, 1996) by means such as proactively resolving conflicts among them. Besides, reciprocity plays a key role in fostering cooperative behaviour. If one party behaves cooperatively, it should anticipate a reciprocal response from its counterpart (Cheung et al., 2008). Through the appropriate use of incentive schemes, contracting parties are, hence, willing to cooperate reciprocally to maximise their mutual benefits.

- **Managerial Implications:** the effects of incentive schemes on cooperative behaviour may largely depend on their implementation and design. Prudently designed schemes with clear objectives are, thus, recommended. With that in mind, professional implementation and management would maximise its effectiveness in fostering cooperation between contracting parties.

## MEDIATING AND MODERATING THE EFFECT OF APOLOGIES ON POSITIVE RESPONSES IN CONSTRUCTION DISPUTE NEGOTIATIONS

**Undergraduate: Second Award (QS)**  
**Awardee: YU Ka In, Karen**  
**(City University of Hong Kong)**

Endorsed by The Hong Kong Department of Justice's Steering Committee on Mediation, the appropriateness of enacting apology legislation in Hong Kong was thoroughly reviewed in

recent years. After two rounds of consultation, Hong Kong's first-ever Apology Ordinance was finally enacted in mid-July 2017 to promote and encourage the issuance of apologies with a view to resolving disputes. In construction dispute negotiations, two extreme results are likely when negotiations become protracted. One is an apology being offered by the side with an interest in continuing negotiations; the other is a breakdown of negotiations.

This study focuses on the ways an apology shapes the response of each party, in particular towards an amicable outcome. Based on Kelman's theory of Response Restriction (1957), attitude change can be reciprocated by the behaviour of each party. As such, positive responses are expected in return for an apology. The role of an apologist can be either as a mediator, moderator, or both. A review of previous studies suggested four common types of apology that are designed to elicit a positive response: tactical, explanatory, formal, and happy-ending.

This proposition was tested with data collected from paper-based and online questionnaires conducted in Hong Kong. 103 valid responses were received from local construction professionals. With these data in hand, the author performed mediated and moderated regression analysis. The mediating effect of a tactical apology and moderating effect of a happy-ending one were found to have notable effects on negotiations. Thus far, a happy-ending apology has been the most versatile in bringing about positive responses to construction dispute negotiations. Negotiators should, therefore, focus on these two elements when addressing an apology in order to settle a dispute. The emotion of the recipient and context of an apology should also be scrutinised to ensure that it is sincere.

### New CPD Registration System

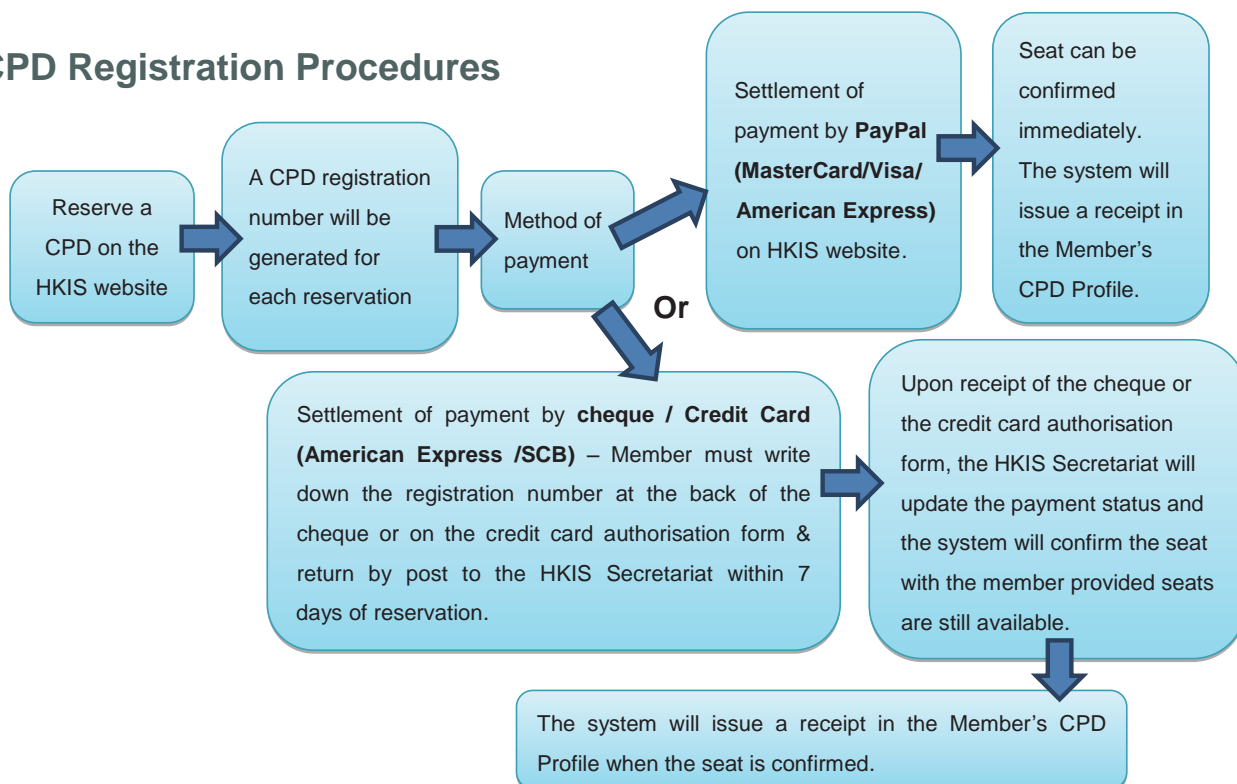
The HKIS will introduce a new CPD registration system in early December 2018. The new CPD system will shorten the processing time for CPD registration and seats can be confirmed immediately when members settle payment of registration fee by PayPal (MasterCard/Visa/American Express).

In the new registration system, a member is required to log into the Member's Area and get a registration number for settling payment provided that seats are available. Seats cannot be confirmed until the HKIS Secretariat receives the payment. Members may settle payment

instantly by PayPal. When members complete the transaction successfully, a receipt will be available in the Member's CPD Profile and the seat can be confirmed immediately.

Alternatively, members may pay by cheque or by completing the credit card authorisation form, they will need to write down their registration number at the back of the cheque or in the credit card authorisation form and return it to the HKIS Secretariat within 7 days otherwise their reservations will be considered unsuccessful. The HKIS Secretariat will then update the payment status by manual input and the system will confirm the seat. Although the HKIS Secretariat will update the payment status from time to time, there is however no guarantee that seats would be available after 7 days. Therefore, members would be encouraged to settle payment by PayPal in order to secure a seat. If the HKIS Secretariat does not receive the payment within 7 days, the registration number will be invalid and the seat will be released to the next applicant in the queue.

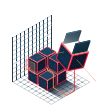

**Notice of Withdrawal of Membership**

On behalf of The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors (HKIS), I write to inform you that the General Council of the HKIS has resolved to withdraw as a member of WAVO with effect from 31 December 2018, in accordance with the Constitution of WAVO.

As a founding member of WAVO, the decision to withdraw was made after careful deliberation of issues relating to the management of WAVO.

In particular, we draw your attention to the handling of the business relating to the 2018 Annual General Meeting ("AGM") which was held on 26 June 2018 and how communication with the HKIS has been handled recently.

- Changes to the Constitution**  
Changes to the Constitution are a very important matter for an organisation. The HKIS did not have an opportunity to study the proposed amendments prior to the AGM, and thus were unable to reflect its grave concerns about the proposed amendments. The Revised Notice of AGM covering the agenda item for the proposed amendments of the WAVO Constitution was sent on 12 June 2018 and the AGM took place on 26 June 2018 which meant that the time period in between was only 2 weeks. This time period did not comply with the Constitution as not less than one month's notice is required for notice for business to be transacted at a general meeting. Furthermore, the Revised Notice of AGM was not sent to the HKIS representative in WAVO but was only copied to the HKIS Secretariat without giving details in the covering email.
- Representation in the Executive Committee**  
2.1 The HKIS, as a founding member of WAVO, has been deprived of having a formal representative in the existing Executive Committee. We were not advised that the then incumbent Executive Committee had drawn up a list of nominees for the incoming Executive Committee. The HKIS did not receive any notification or invitation to make a nomination to be a member of the Executive Committee.

The HKIS representative in WAVO has not been advised of the business of WAVO including being provided with the minutes of the Executive Committee meeting of November 2017 at the AGM.

We would also like to make it clear that no person can claim himself/herself as a representative of the HKIS while participating in the activities of WAVO with effect from the date of our withdrawal, while Sr C K Lau is still the only representative of the HKIS until the date of our withdrawal.

## Parts I and II Assessments for Professional Competency, Fall 2018

Over 60 candidates attempted the four papers of the Part I Assessment for Professional Competency (APC) on 6 and 13 October. Each paper took one hour to complete after a 15-minute reading period was given to the candidates. Awards will be presented to the best performers in the four papers, while a grand award will be given to the candidate(s) with the best overall performance. Candidates will be informed of their results in early November.

Over 50 candidates will attempt the Part II Assessment in December 2018. The GPD cordially invites experienced surveyors to serve as assessors. A briefing session for them is scheduled for late November. Good luck to all candidates.

## Executive Talk Series by Sr Augustine Wong, Executive Director, Henderson Land Development Co, Ltd (Code: 2018193)

On 4 October, Sr Augustine Wong delivered an Executive Talk entitled, “Balanced Community and Implementation Modes,” to HKU’s Department of Real Estate and Construction. Sr Alex Lam, HKIS Honorary Treasurer and GPD Vice Chairman, warmly welcomed the speaker. During the talk, which attracted 120 participants, Sr Wong shared his views pertaining to the territory-wide public consultation on land supply. While the shortfall in public housing over the past decade

has intensified the competition for land in Hong Kong, a homogenous urban development model dominated by public housing would come at the expense of a diversified community.

Going by international experiences, a mixed development model that aims to foster a more balanced community can be a sustainable solution. To engage the private sector, whose land holdings are fragmented and not ripe for development under a mixed development model, Sr Wong proposed a modified land bond system. Two members of the Task Force on Land Supply – Sr Prof KW Chau and Prof Jimmy Leung – and a group of students discussed the speaker’s novel ideas with him after the talk.



## CPD: Land Issues in Utility Company (Code: 2018064)

Thanks go to a team of GP surveyors from the Property Branch of CLP Power Hong Kong Limited – Sr Eric Tsang, Sr Margaret Lai, and Sr Joey Wong – for delivering this CPD on 25 October. Eric first shared the roles of GP surveyors in establishing power stations and substations, along with the roles of project manager and stakeholder manager, during site reservations under statutory town plans and land acquisitions by way of private treaty grants. Margaret then regaled the audience on the land document types used for wayleaves acquisition projects and the independent checking engineer approach to facilitate CLP's cable tower-strengthening works. She also showed a video of CLP's offshore liquefied natural gas (LNG) terminal project and highlighted the importance of stakeholder management of this kind of rare, but territory-wide, venture. Last, Joey shared the leading land policy of the premium assessment for granting land to be used in utility installations and the key principles of the "shoebox" approach to assessing the notional GFA for valuation purposes.

With Hong Kong's rapidly-changing environment and the evolving expectations of different stakeholders, there will be greater land issue challenges for GP surveyors who have to maintain the city's power supply in more environmentally-friendly ways.

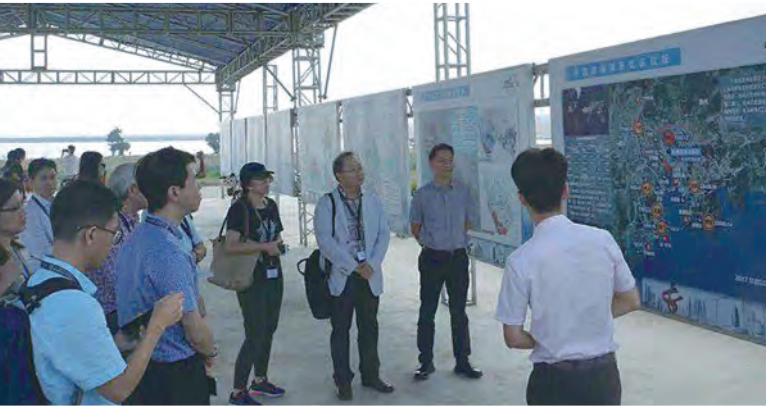

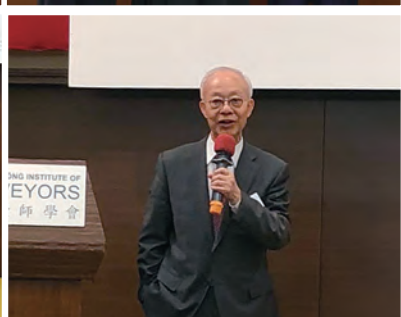


## Meeting with the Directors of Lands and Buildings

## Quality Property and Facility Management Award 2018

The first screening of the submitted nominations was completed by the assessors and 40 project sites were shortlisted for further assessment. On-site inspections to these project sites were conducted from 20-21 October. They are categorised as follows:

Office Building Management (Large Scale Office Building)	4 project sites
Industrial & Car Park Building Management	2 project sites
Institutional Facility Management	2 project sites
<b>Total</b>	<b>40 project sites</b>

Each site was inspected by at least two assessors from the HKIS and Hong Kong Association of Property Management Companies (HKAPMC). Each assessor was given a set of score sheets with judging criteria for scoring purposes.

The secretariat office advised the project sites in advance that they should conduct a five-minute presentation and allow for a 25-minute site visit. The total time spent at each project site was 30 minutes. Stringent time controls were imposed to avoid serious overruns and ensure fairness to all project sites.

The weighting of the score for each project site is as follows:

<b>First Screening</b>	<b>10%</b>
<b>Site Visit</b>	<b>20%</b>
<b>Finalist Presentation to Jury</b>	<b>70%</b>

After the site visit, 32 finalists were shortlisted to participate in the final stage of the judging process – Finalist Presentations to the Judging Panel cum Conference – which will be held on 10 November 2018 (Saturday) at the Chiang Chen Studio Theatre. Including the four International Innovative Strategic Management project sites, a total of 36 finalists will make presentations to the jury.

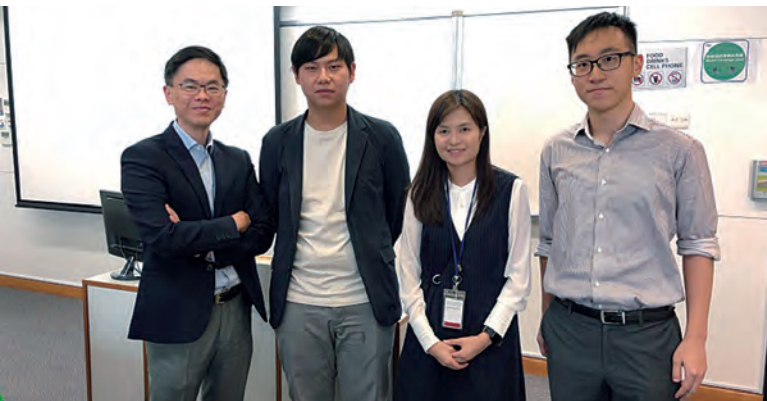

## Career Talk at the IVE (Morrison Hill), 5 October 2018

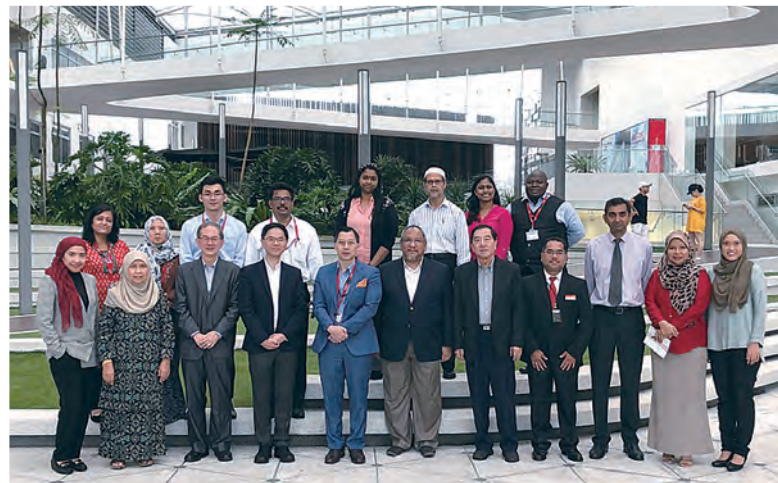

Their opinions are precious to me, who is just starting to engage more with the surveying industry.

As a student, I received a rare opportunity to become involved in this grand and meaningful event. I was very honoured and lucky to be part of it. It was more a lesson that challenged me to think and encouraged me to pursue my dreams than a conference. Distinguished guests like government officials and veteran surveyors were invited to deliver talks that focused on a sophisticated Hong Kong puzzle: its lack of land resources. A few aspects, including the facilitation of the development process, town planning, and increasing land supply, were illustrated.

The most inspirational idea was in the speech delivered by Miss Ada Ys Fung, BBS, on the future development of building information modelling (BIM). At university, students who study surveying are familiar with BIM. In an age of rapid advances in information technology, utilising software is of paramount importance for enhancing the efficiency of property development. Technology improves Hong Kong's accessibility and has become more user-friendly. The city has entered a technology-led era, which can boost its development.

This conference was a brand-new experience for me to learn about Hong Kong's current developmental situation. Thanks to the work of today's speakers and guests, the city should have a brighter future to facilitate its development.
